SELECTED ADVENTURE-RELATED EXPERIENCES

Around Denmark by seakayak – trying to seek adventures near home, I completed a record solo 1,200 km circumnavigation in 24 days. 2008

Bicycling solo across the Last Himalayan Kingdom – cycled 1,000 kilometers west-east across the isolated, mountainous Kingdom of Bhutan and trekked to the remote land of the Layap yakherders. 2007.

Seakayak-circumnavigating the Island of New Caledonia in the South Pacific Ocean – paddled 900 kilometers around this rugged, windswept island with Kristine Korsgaard encountering sea snakes, big waves and whales during the 4-week endeavor. 2006.

Paddling in the tropical paradise of the Fiji Islands – completed a 3-week and 700 kilometer seakayak-circumnavigation of the Vanua Levu Island – one of the two main islands of Fiji - with Kristine Korsgaard. 2005.

Mountaineering in Patagonia – visited one of the wildest, stormiest mountain ranges in the world, situated on the tip of South America, and climbed the peak of Aguja Guillaumet. 2003.

Climbing Denali, the highest peak in Alaska – participated in a two-man expedition to the 6,184 m Denali, often named the coldest mountain on earth, and did a successful ascent of the Upper West Rib route. 2003.

High mountains, avalanches and bandits in Bolivia – a two-man adventure into the heart of South America with an epic ascent of the remote 6,368 m Illampu among others. 2002.

Bigwall climbing in South Greenland – established a new route on the West Face of Ulamatorsuaq in the Tasermiut Fiord. The climb involved 900 vertical meters of rock climbing and camping on the wall for seven continuous days. 2000.

High-altitude mountaineering in Peru – ascended what is said to be two of the world's most beautiful peaks - Alpamayo and Artesanraju - as well as Peru's highest mountain, the 6,768 m Huascaran. 1999.

Alone on a Bigwall – climbed the granite monolith of El Capitan in California twice by the routes of Tangerine Trip and Zodiac. The last route was done solo and took 5 days with 4 nights spent camping on the 600 meter overhanging cliff. 1998.

Frozen waterfalls – climbed numerous frozen waterfalls in Europe, including the first Danish ascent of Hydnefossen in Norway and an ascent of Juvsojla (both are graded WI 6). 1998-1999.

Exploring the European Alps – ascended numerous classic mountaineering routes, mainly in the Mt. Blanc range, both in summer and in winter, including an epic winter ascent of the Swiss route on the North Face of Les Courtes. 1996-1997.
